FEGENTRI World Championship for Lady and Gentlemen Riders

JULY 5TH, 2025 – HAMBURG, GERMANY – LADY RIDERS

The twelfth race of the season for the Lady Riders took place on the prestigious Deutsches Derby weekend in Hamburg, offering a vibrant stage for international competition for our FEGENTRI riders. Belgium's nominated rider Lize Dieteren delivered an great performance, claiming her second FEGENTRI victory of the season aboard ROSE OF ENGLAND.

JULY 6TH, 2025 – BUDAPEST, HUNGARY – LADY RIDERS

The second FEGENTRI race of an action-packed weekend brought the Lady Riders to the iconic Kincsem Park racetrack in Budapest, Hungary. Held on Magyar Derby Day, the event offered a fantastic atmosphere and an unforgettable racing experience for the FEGENTRI participants. In a strong display of riding skills, Cecilia Schnyder, representing Switzerland, claimed a decisive victory. The Swiss rider crossed the finish line first after the straight race of 1200 meters on TONALE, marking an important milestone in her FEGENTRI season. Kincsem Park, with its rich history and enthusiastic crowd, proved once again to be a fitting venue for world-class amateur racing.

JULY 15TH, 2025 – VICHY, FRANCE – GENTLEMEN-RIDERS

The FEGENTRI Gentlemen-Riders had the honor of participating in one of the highlights of the French racing calendar: the renowned summer meeting at Vichy. Known for its festive atmosphere and historic charm, the event offered an exceptional setting for international amateur competition. Rising to the occasion, Gonzalo Pineda Carmena of Spain celebrated a memorable moment by securing his first victory of the championship aboard PATZESTEVE. Following the excitement on the track, riders enjoyed a relaxed and convivial evening along the scenic Allier River—a fitting close to a day that blended sport, culture, and camaraderie in true FEGENTRI spirit.

JULY 20TH, 2025 – KARLOVY VARY, CZECH REPUBLIC – LADY RIDERS

The FEGENTRI Lady Riders were warmly welcomed to Karlovy Vary in Czech Republic, where they had the opportunity to compete on one of Central Europe's most scenic and historic racecourses. The day marked a historic milestone for Hungary, as Judit Dickinson, nominated Hungarian Lady Rider, claimed a superb victory aboard NIKOLETA. With this performance, Judit became the first Hungarian Lady Rider to win a FEGENTRI race abroad as a national representative riding an English Thoroughbred—an inspiring achievement for both her and her country.

JULY 26TH, 2025 – MADRID, SPAIN – TWO RACES - GENTLEMEN AND LADY RIDERS

The vibrant city of Madrid, Spain hosted a truly special evening for FEGENTRI, with two separate races held for both Lady and Gentlemen-Riders at the renowned Hipódromo de la Zarzuela. In front of an enthusiastic crowd, Sara Horcajada, representing Spain, delivered a brilliant performance to claim victory in the Lady Riders' race aboard CHIQUININO. Her win in her home country was met with well-deserved celebration and national pride.

In the Gentlemen-Riders' race, Diego Sarabia, non-nominated Spanish rider, added a personal triumph to the evening by guiding his own horse, THE WHIPMASTER, to victory. The Madrid races provided yet another example of FEGENTRI's commitment to bringing international amateur riders together in iconic venues. It was a night marked by excitement, national success, and the spirit of friendly competition that defines the FEGENTRI community.

JULY 28TH, 2025 – OSTENDE, BELGIUM – TWO RACES - GENTLEMEN AND LADY RIDERS

On Monday, July 28th, the picturesque seaside racecourse of Ostende, Belgium, hosted an exciting trio of FEGENTRI races,

bringing together Lady Riders, Gentlemen-Riders, and FEGENTRI Junior Riders for a full afternoon of international amateur competition. In the Ladies' race, Janina Boysen, representing Germany, delivered a strong and confident ride aboard MANZANO to secure the win, making it her fourth FEGENTRI victory this season. Close behind in second was Lize Dieteren of Belgium, riding her own horse PREMIERE ETOILE, while Solange Gourdain of France took third place on LOVER MIMI. The competitive field and strong finishes made for a thrilling contest, cheered on by a lively Belgian crowd. In the Mixed race, run over 1600 meters, it was Fred Tett of Great Britain—riding as a non-nominated participant—who
