FEAGENTRI World Championship for Lady and Gentlemen Riders

JUNE 2, 2025 – ROME, ITALY – LADY RIDERS
The beautiful city of Rome hosted the fourth leg of the FEAGENTRI World Championship for Lady Riders, held on the prestigious Derby Day at Capannelle Racecourse. With an atmosphere full of history and grandeur, the race brought out the best in our riders.
Tereza Grbavcicova, the nominated representative for the Czech Republic, emerged victorious aboard ROUZELETS SWEETY, showcasing exceptional riding skills. We extend our gratitude to our Italian hosts and the Capannelle team for their warm welcome and generous hospitality.

JUNE 9, 2025 – FRAUENFELD, SWITZERLAND – LADY RIDERS
The fifth stage of the championship unfolded in the charming Swiss town of Frauenfeld, where race day followed a convivial evening shared with officials and supporters. The friendly atmosphere was matched by competitive spirit on the track. Yvonne Donzé, a non-nominated Swiss rider, delivered a brilliant performance to claim victory riding FLASHY ARROW. Her triumph was celebrated with enthusiasm by local supporters and fellow riders alike.

JUNE 15, 2025 – CHANTILLY, FRANCE – LADY RIDERS
Chantilly, with its historic charm and equestrian prestige, set the stage for the sixth race in the championship. Taking place on the same day as the iconic Prix de Diane Longines, the Prix de la Reine Marie-Amélie, third race on the card, featured a strong field of 16 Lady Riders.
French rider Astrid Peltier, both rider and owner of the horse, triumphed in this significant race aboard POPORO, marking her second win in this prestigious event following her 2023 victory. This year's win held special meaning as her entire Jour de Galop work team was present to support her—a moment of deep personal and professional pride.
The weekend also included engaging social events for the Lady Riders, such as friendly games and a relaxed barbecue hosted by the French Amateur Club on the historic Les Aigles gallops.

For the first time this season, two FEAGENTRI mixed races were hosted in Oslo, Norway, where both Lady and Gentlemen Riders competed side by side on a beautifully sunny Saturday.
In the first race, French rider Solange Gourdain earned her first FEAGENTRI victory of the season over a swift 900-meter race. The second race saw a home win, with Norwegian rider Frida Sandbraaten also claiming her maiden FEAGENTRI success. The day concluded with a spirited evening celebration that highlighted the camaraderie among riders and hosts alike.

FEGENTRI Gentlemen’s League Championship (Jumps)

JUNE 14, 2025 – STRÖMSHOLM, SWEDEN

The third round of the 2025 FEGENTRI Gentlemen’s League Championship took place in the historic surroundings of Strömsholm, Sweden, during the much-anticipated Grand National day. Known for its festive spirit and vibrant crowds, the event proved to be an ideal stage for international amateur competition. Joshua Halford, representing Ireland, delivered an exceptional ride to claim victory, earning 10 valuable championship points. His win brings forward Ireland’s strong presence in this year’s championship. Ellie Holder, the English representative and one of the few female competitors in the FEGENTRI

Gentlemen’s League, showed determination and skill to secure second place, adding 7 points to her season total. Elliot Öhgren, racing on home turf for Sweden, finished strongly in third place, earning 5 championship points and much local applause. Romain Lemièrre, representing France, unfortunately faced disqualification due to being unable to cross the post within the allowed time. Despite the setback, he was awarded 1 point for participation and remains competitive in the overall ranking. The day concluded with a festive party on the racecourse grounds, where riders, officials, and spectators came together in celebration—highlighting once again the camaraderie and shared passion that define the FEGENTRI experience.

FEGENTRI Junior Championship

JUNE 29, 2025 – BRO PARK, SWEDEN

Bro Park was also the proud host of the latest round of the FEGENTRI Junior Championship, which focuses on fostering the next generation of international amateur riders. The weekend offered an enriching blend of education, training, and racing for the young competitors. On the eve of the competition, all participants took part in practical sessions aimed at preparing both horse and rider. Riders had the opportunity to familiarize themselves with their mounts, test equipment, and rehearse starting procedures—ensuring readiness for race day. The morning of the event featured a fitness and technical workshop, including hands-on exercises with a horse simulator under the expert guidance of José Lopera. The session emphasized balance, rhythm, and technique—core skills for aspiring amateur jockeys. The Junior Race itself delivered a spirited contest. Mathis Moeykens, representing Belgium, demonstrated strong riding skills to win aboard STEYN, the same pony he rode in the previous season. His familiarity with the mount and composed execution led him to a deserved victory, adding another chapter to his FEGENTRI results. The Junior Championship continues to be a vital pillar of FEGENTRI’s mission: to educate, support, and inspire future ambassadors of amateur racing on the international stage.
