

AUGUST 3RD, 2025 - SAN SEBASTIÁN, SPAIN - MIXED RACE

The fourth mixed race of the season for Gentlemen and Lady Riders was held at the picturesque racecourse of San Sebastián, offering a wonderful setting for this first race of August of the FEGENTRI World Championship.

Spain's nominated rider, Gonzalo Pineda Carmena, rose to the occasion and delivered a remarkable performance on home soil. Showing both confidence and determination, he guided PAMPLONA to a well-deserved victory, securing his second FEGENTRI win of the season.

It was a memorable step in Spain, with this beautiful mixed race generously added to the calendar by the Spanish Amateur Club AEGRI.

AUGUST 7TH, 2025 - LEOPARDSTOWN, IRELAND - MIXED RACE

The first race of a busy FEGENTRI weekend took place at the iconic Leopardstown Racecourse in Dublin, Ireland. Both the Lady Riders and the local nominated Gentleman-Rider, Joshua Halford, lined up to represent their countries and showcase their talent at this renowned racetrack.

In a thrilling 3000-meters contest, it was Teagan Padgett, representing Great Britain, who stole the spotlight by leading the race from start to finish. With a strong and confident ride, she guided LOUIESCALL to victory, securing her second FEGENTRI win of the season. The riders finished the day with a welcoming dinner organized by Patrick Mullins and the Qualified Riders Association.

AUGUST 8TH, 2025 – CLAIREFONTAINE, FRANCE – LADY RIDERS AND GENTLEMEN-RIDERS (TWO RACES)

On Friday, August 8th, the FEGENTRI amateur riders gathered at the Clairefontaine racecourse, near Deauville, France, for two exciting international contests. The venue, renowned for its summer racing, provided the perfect stage to welcome both Lady Riders and Gentlemen-Riders from around the world.

The afternoon began in the best possible way for the French team, with a superb victory for French representative Solange Gourdain. Riding ELUSIVE NELSON for trainer Stéphane Labate, she delivered a determined and well-judged performance that secured her an important win. This success earned her ten valuable points in the championship standings, moving her up to joint fourth place in the August provisional rankings.

In the Gentlemen-Riders' race, the spotlight shifted to the Czech Republic. Matyas Luka produced another excellent ride to guide PICNIC ROYAL, trained by Jess Parize, to victory. This marked his second success at Clairefontaine, further underlining his strength and consistency over his years riding in the FEGENTRI Championship.

The day of sport concluded in style with a festive summer gala held at the Hotel Barrière in Deauville, offering riders, officials, and supporters the opportunity to celebrate the spirit of international amateur racing in a convivial atmosphere.

AUGUST 14TH, 2025 - LIVORNO, ITALY - LADY RIDERS

The FEGENTRI Lady Riders were warmly welcomed to Livorno, Italy, for the 21st race of the FEGENTRI World Championship for Lady Riders, held on Friday, August 14th. The seaside racecourse provided a beautiful backdrop for an evening of international competition, with the entire field composed exclusively of FEGENTRI riders—an occasion that perfectly reflected the global spirit of the Championship.

Local hopes were high, and the Italian team did not disappoint. Francesca Cecchini, riding as the second representative for Italy, delivered a commanding performance aboard her own horse TIMBA REEL. With determination and precision, she claimed victory, securing an important success on home soil.

This triumph marked Italy's first win in this year's Championship, a proud moment for both Francesca and the host nation, celebrated enthusiastically by the local supporters.

AUGUST 21ST, 2025 – CHELMSFORD, GREAT BRITAIN – GENTLEMEN-RIDERS

The Gentlemen-Riders traveled to Chelmsford, England, for the 10th race of the FEGENTRI season in this Championship. The afternoon featured a competitive contest over 2000 meters, with seven international riders lining up at the start.

It was the local contingent who shone brightest on this occasion. Ross Birkett, riding as a non-nominated English representative, guided FIHRAYN to victory, showcasing both skill and experience in front of the home crowd.

Beyond the racetrack, the riders were treated to warm British hospitality. Under the care of Sarah Oliver and the Amateur Jockeys Association of Great Britain, they enjoyed a delightful dinner and a comfortable stay at a beautiful countryside property—an occasion that perfectly captured the camaraderie and international friendships at the heart of FEGENTRI.
